<p><b>Assess and Contextualise</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- To understand and build upon previous work to roll out the CPMS in your context</li> <li>- To make the content of the standards appropriate and meaningful to the context</li> </ul>	<p><b>Raise Awareness</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- To encourage buy-in from key actors to apply the CPMS</li> <li>- To gather support from government and humanitarian actors to promote and implement the CPMS</li> </ul>	<p><b>Build Capacities</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- To support international and national actors to adopt new approaches in the 2019 CPMS</li> </ul>	<p><b>Institutionalise and Monitor Application</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- To improve quality, predictability and accountability of child protection and integrated, multisectoral approaches in humanitarian action</li> </ul>
<p><b>Key Actions</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Fill out the Assessment Checklist within your agency or as an inter-agency coordination group</li> <li>✓ Hold a national contextualisation workshop or use the Contextualisation Checklist to build on previous work</li> <li>✓ Ensure national and local actors play a leading role in the process</li> <li>✓ Identify opportunities for collaborating with other sectors/ clusters, government partners and development actors</li> </ul>	<p><b>Key Actions</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Translate the CPMS and/ or CPMS Summary version into local languages if needed</li> <li>✓ Hold a launch event, targeted briefings or webinar at the national and sub-national levels</li> <li>✓ Key targets: Humanitarian agencies, government actors, other sector clusters/ coordination groups and senior humanitarian leaders</li> <li>✓ Outcome: A follow-up plan for key steps to implement the CPMS</li> <li>✓ Awareness raising can take place simultaneously with other steps</li> </ul>	<p><b>Key Actions</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Prioritise capacity-building events on new standards and approaches that meet contextual needs</li> <li>✓ Use the following training packages to support in-person or online capacity building:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Frontliner’s Training Package</li> <li>• Face-to-Face Training Package</li> <li>• CPMS E-Course</li> </ul> </li> <li>✓ Include staff from other sectors and clusters in key trainings</li> <li>✓ Ensure the equal participation of national and local actors</li> <li>✓ Update capacity-building plans based on identified needs in the standards</li> </ul>	<p><b>Key Actions</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Revise inter-agency response plans and agency-specific child protection strategic plans and work plans to reflect key actions, indicators and notes of contextualised standards</li> <li>✓ Use the standards to advocate and fundraise for child protection in the context</li> <li>✓ Hold national and sub-national trainings on the contextualised standards for all child protection actors, especially national and local actors</li> <li>✓ Use the contextualised indicators in inter-agency and agency-specific monitoring and evaluation plans</li> </ul>
