
The Alliance Strategy (2021-2025)




The **CENTRALITY** of **CHILDREN** and their **PROTECTION** is recognised and prioritised as **ESSENTIAL** and **LIFE-SAVING** across the humanitarian system.

The centrality of children and their protection reflects a greater to need to prioritise children, broadly, and their protection and well-being, specifically, across the humanitarian system.

The centrality of children and their protection begins with recognising children as a distinct group from adults, with unique and diverse needs and capacities that differ by age, gender, ability, and other diversity factors.



It is time to recognise children for who they are: a unique, diverse, and significant group of rights holders, with the right to be treated with dignity, the right to be heard, and the right to exercise their agency and be actively involved in the programmes and decisions that affect their lives.

Case Management



This Task Force is a group of experts and practitioners who work together to improve the quality and effectiveness of child protection case management in humanitarian settings.

Children Associated with Armed Forces and Armed Groups



This Task Force provides technical support and capacity building to strengthen quality programming in emergencies that prevent recruitment, facilitates release, and responds to the needs of children associated with armed forces or armed groups.

Cash and Child Protection



This Task Force documents evidence on the impact and effectiveness of Cash and Voucher Assistance on child protection outcomes in emergencies, their potential for greater use and impact, and their risks to improve policy and practise.

This Task Force ensures practical coordination and collaboration amongst humanitarian responders and development actors to strengthen the quality and coordination of child labour preparedness, prevention and response actions in emergencies.


